All I Want for Christmas!

“All I want for Christmas is my two front teeth.” Do you remember that little song? It was cute, but dumb. What kid in his or her right mind would say that’s *all* I want for Christmas?

As a child I lived in a small community between the school and the church, about a hundred yards from each. In those days I found it hard to get up at 6:30 each morning for school. For some reason it was even harder to get up at 8:30 for Sunday school. But getting up at 3 o’clock on Christmas morning was never a problem.

Even today I can almost smell the cedar from the Christmas tree and the oranges that were placed around it on those crisp Louisiana mornings. And I still sense the thrill when I switched on the light to see the neatly arranged gifts spread out on the floor for my brothers and me. Let’s be honest, we all love receiving gifts.

It’s “more blessed to give than to receive.” That’s true. But it can be okay to want to receive, too. In fact God tells us to “covet earnestly the best gifts...” (1 Corinthians 12:31).

What are some good gifts for your wish list this Christmas? How about a happy home, a revived church, a godly nation? Or you might request things like joy, hope, peace, love, faith. Or how about some personal needs that include a pure heart, a clean mind, a faithful life?

How about giving some special gifts to ourselves, gifts that will last long after this Christmas? Here are some suggestions:

1. *Continue your education.* Let it include not just man’s books, but God’s Book. “as newborn babes, desire the sincere milk of the word, that ye may grow thereby” (1 Peter 2:2). “Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth” (2 Timothy 2:15).

2. *Improve your love life.* Get involved with the greatest love. Jesus said “Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind” (Matthew 22:37). “And the Lord make you to increase and abound in love one toward another, and toward all...” (1 Thessalonians 3:12).

3. *Discover & use your spiritual gifts to glorify God.* “Follow after charity, and desire spiritual gifts...” (1 Corinthians 14:1).

4. *Enter public service.* It is not necessary to run for office to do this. If you know Jesus you have already been appointed as “an ambassadors for Christ...” (2 Corinthians 5:20). Make a difference. Be a leader? How? By focusing on how you can serve. Jesus said, “whosoever will be great among you, shall be your minister” (Mark 10:43). “As we have therefore opportunity, let us do good unto all...” (Galatians 6:10).

5. *Contact a Friend in High Places.* It’s not what you know but who you know that counts, especially if that person is your friend, Jesus Christ. He is your benefactor, the source of whatever is needed. “But my God shall supply all your need according to his riches in glory by Christ Jesus” (Philippians 4:19).

6. *Experience closeness in church family.* “...that their hearts might be comforted, being knit together in love” (Colossians 2:2). “Even so ye, forasmuch as ye are zealous of spiritual gifts, seek that ye may excel to the edifying of the church.” (1 Corinthians 14:12).

7. *Invest in your future in Heaven.* First, make sure you have a future home in Heaven. That comes only through receiving the greatest Gift of all—the Lord Jesus Christ. “Not by works of righteousness which we have done, but according to his mercy he saved us...” (Titus 3:5). If you have received Jesus as your Savior, then it is time to “...seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth” (Col. 3:1-2).


What do you want for Christmas? Why not give yourself something big, something that will last, something that must come from God?

Some gifts you can give this Christmas are beyond monetary value: Mend a quarrel, dismiss suspicion, tell someone, “I love you.” Give something away—anonymously. Forgive someone who has treated you wrong. Turn away wrath with a soft answer. Visit someone in a nursing home. Apologize if you were wrong. Be especially kind to someone with whom you work. Give as God gave to you in Christ, without obligation, or announcement, or reservation, or hypocrisy.

Ask yourself what you are seeing and hearing this Christmas Season.

- When you watch the TV news do you just see chaos and strife, or do you see sheep without a shepherd?
- When you go out to do your shopping do you see only hordes of people in the stores, or do you notice worried expressions on faces that are crying for help, help they can only find in Jesus?

What do you hear this Christmas?

- Do you hear only the blast of music and carols, or do you hear the silent sighs of the lonely and the bereaved who may be dreading Christmas because it accentuates their loneliness?

What Else is There?

Your compulsion must be like Paul's, who said, "woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospel!" (1 Cor. 9:16).

When you finish that next busy Sunday ask yourself if you really have the passion of Jeremiah or the compulsion of Paul. You will probably find that God has you doing just what He prepared you for all along.

When You Preach, Remember

When you enter the pulpit make no apologies. If you have a message from God, deliver it. Do not waste time by long prefaces; but say good things from the start. And do not keep on talking after you are finished. Better leave the people longing than loathing.

Leave self out of the pulpit and take Christ in. Do not preach old sermons without warming them over. And never stop growing.

Do not harp too much on one string, but give the great variety of the Bible.

Take care of your character—let God take care of your reputation.

Do not abuse people for not liking you. Perhaps you like yourself too well. Blame them for not loving Jesus.

You are not a preacher, no matter whose hands have been laid upon you, unless you know the truth and are anointed by the Holy Spirit. Do not scold. Be a friend of sinners, but not of sin.

Give something special when you preach to those who come on rainy days. Christ preached marvelously to one woman at the well and to one rabbi at night.

It is easy to manage a congregation when they are kept near to Christ. Forsake Him, and your congregation will (and should) forsake you!

You can do everything God wants you to do. What you do depends on what you are.

Christians You Should Know!

Christmas Evans **1766 - 1838**

“Always have a book to read, instead of indulging in vain conversations. Remember this, that you cannot commit some loved sin in private and perform the work of the ministry in public with facility and acceptance.”

Christmas Evans was born in Wales on December 25, 1766. His father died when he was very young, and he went to live with a wicked, ungodly uncle.

Despite the bitterness and trials of his life, he accepted Jesus Christ as Savior at the age of seventeen.

He had no formal education, but managed to teach himself Hebrew and Greek so he could study the Bible.

Shortly after his conversion one of his eyes was gouged out when he was badly beaten by former friends because

of his new faith. But he kept reading and studying to broaden his knowledge of God.

Evans was ordained a Baptist minister when he was 23, pastoring a church in Lleyn. Two years later, he had the opportunity to preach as a substitute to 20,000 people in Felinfoel. Great doors of opportunity opened to him after that.

But he believed God wanted him to serve on the island of Anglesea, and ministered there for the next 34 years. Much was accomplished as he united the warring Baptist societies to be effective evangelistic workers for God. But he left the island at age 59 with a broken heart when thousands turned their backs on him and the Gospel he preached.

After the death of his wife in 1823, Evans relocated to Caernarvon where he took a small, struggling church. He led the congregation to pay off their debts and saw the church marvelously blessed of God with converts.

His preaching started what became known as the “Welsh Revival.” Thousands were saved as the power of God shook the country. Men and women traveled from everywhere to hear Evans preach.

On his last Sunday at the church, Evans preached on the Prodigal Son. Friday of that week as he lay dying, he said, “I have never ministered without the blood in the basin.”

His last words were, “Drive on!”

The True Meaning of Christmas
